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SHAKEY WINS!

SHANE BYRNE

British Superbike Championship

Paul Bird Motorsport / Be Wiser Ducati

In one of the most dramatic finishes to the season in many years, FUCHS Silkolene ambassador Shane 'Shakey' Byrne claimed the 2017 title in the most dramatic style at Brands Hatch when he overcame a 33 point deficit to win a historic sixth British Superbike Championship title.


Riding the factory-backed Ducati Panigale R, the Londoner knew the odds were stacked against him following a poor run of results in recent rounds, which saw him trailing title-rival Leon Haslam.

The weekend started well for Bryne by claiming victory in the opening race, reducing the gap to 21 points before



another amazing drive saw Shakey gain a 2nd race win in race two with Haslam only managing 10th place.

The difference was now down to just two points meaning Shakey had to better Leon's finishing position. On lap six it was advantage Byrne as Haslam crashed out. Shakey ensured he remained upright for the remainder of the race and crossed the line in 8th to claim his record breaking 6th BSB title.



WINTER MOTORCYCLE CARE

It's that time of year when many riders will put their bikes in the garage until the nicer weather returns in 2018.

Read our tips to help keep your pride and joy in top condition until spring has sprung.



CHANGE OIL

After a seasons riding, changing the oil prior to any prolonged period of storage will help drain out any sludge or contaminants that may deposit in your sump. The engine will also benefit from this and prevent causing any additional wear and tear when it's started up again in the new season. Engine oil is the 'life-blood' of any engine. The cleaner, the better.

PROTECT

With fluids changed and your bike washed, it is a good idea to go round the bike and seal any exposed metal parts, bolts and screws with a good water repellent spray (such as Silkolene PRO PREP and/or All in One) to help prevent corrosion or rust while the bike is stored. Make sure you choose a product that is either safe to use on all body parts and exposed rubbers & plastics, or be sure to only apply to the metal exposed parts. A dab of good old household Vaseline can also do a good job but it's a lot messier to clean off in the springtime!

CHARGE

TYRES

If possible, it's a good idea to store your bike off the ground on motorcycle stands, to prevent any part of the rubber tyre standing on the same contact spot of floor for a long period of time. Alternatively you can regularly move the bike and rotate the wheels throughout the storage period.

COVER

Store your bike under a clean and fitted motorcycle cover made of a breathable fabric.

Joe Collier Racing

Joe has had a fantastic 2017, claiming the Ducati Tri options Cup with a round to spare after 12 race wins out of 16. But who is this racing wizard?

Born in Donington Le Heath in Leicester, 22 year old Joe got his first motorcross bike aged just 4 and he's never looked back, winning many championships.

In 2009 he started Supermoto where he won the British, Nora & Southern all in one year and is currently the only person to have ever achieved this.

In 2010 Joe moved to Aprilia Superteens, finishing 2nd in the newcomers before moving again in 2011 to the Triumph Triple Challenge, coming 12th. At 16, this was a steep learning curve for Joe as he adapted to the larger bike.

From 2012 – 2014 he competed in the Superstock 600 championship gaining podiums all 3 years, finishing 12th, 4th and joint 2nd respectively.

Joe classes his 2015 British Supersort Evo Championship as his greatest motorsport achievement to date - His first road racing British title.

This race season, Joe has excelled with wins in each round of the championship, collecting multiple lap records in the process. Finishing a massive 136.5 points ahead of second place Phil Atkinson, Joe is continuing to make a name for himself around the paddock.

A fully trained electrician, Joe keeps himself busy with motorcross, walking his dog and has undertaken the large task of building his own house!

The results finished Adam 10th in BTCC 2017, 4th in the Independents' Trophy, with Ciceley Motorsport 9th.


RYAN COOKE






Dean Harrison's fast pace continued from the Cock O'the North event setting the circuit's 600 lap record at the 2017 Gold Cup.
